The 51st UIC Shareholder's Annual Meeting will be held **in-person at Fred Ipalook Elementary School and online via Zoom on Saturday, June 1, 2024 at 1:00 pm.** Instructions on how to join the meeting virtually via Zoom and how to vote your proxy electronically and vote online during the meeting are in your shareholder proxy packets and are included below.

If you have not received your proxy packet by Monday, May 13, 2024, please contact the UIC Stock Department at (907) 852-7444 or by email at stock@uicalaska.com.

UIC is once again providing the opportunity for its shareholders to vote their proxies electronically and vote online during the meeting this year. While traditional methods like mailing or faxing paper proxies, or sending them via email are still available, e-voting allows for instant confirmation that your proxy has been received. To participate in e-voting, visit www.voteuic.com and use the blue PIN provided on your proxy that was sent to you in your proxy packet.

For the 2024 Annual Shareholder Meeting, you may vote in the following ways:

- **By proxy** received by the UIC Stock Department **by 5:00 pm, Friday, May 31, 2024.**
 - **Online proxy:** Submit through www.voteUIC.com using the blue PIN that is printed on your proxy form; or
 - **Paper proxy:** Send completed proxies to UIC by e-mail, in-person drop-off, mail, or fax.
- **By ballot** submitted **during the Annual Meeting on Saturday, June 1, 2024.**
 - **Online ballot:** Register and vote online at www.voteUIC.com until the polls close by using the blue PIN that is printed on your proxy form; or

- **In-person ballot:** Register and cast your vote with the Stock Department at Fred Ipalook Elementary School before the polls close.

If you vote online before 5:00 pm on May 17, 2023, you will be eligible for all three (3) voting prizes: early bird prizes, e-vote prizes, and general voting prizes. Additionally, if you attend the Annual Meeting in person in Utqiagvik on June 1, 2024, you will also be eligible for additional cash prizes.
