Summer & Winter Tundra Travel

Getting across tundra is our specialty. Our operators are highly knowledgeable and our equipment is approved by DNR for summer or winter travel. We have the newest and most comfortable Steigers, PistenBullys, Tuckers, Sherps and Specialized Trail Trucks to get our clients and their equipment where they're going.

Equipment Lease & Rentals

We can get you trucks, heavy equipment, and even the laborers you need for your project.



Snow Trail Scouting & Construction

In the last five years, we've built and rebuilt more than 40,000 miles of snow trail across Arctic tundra. These include Community Winter Access Trails that connect communities and get freight, equipment and people to their destinations safely. Need a trail for a specific purpose? We'll map it, submit it for permitting, interface with land owners (from BLM to NSB), and build it.

Remote Camps

We have the personnel and equipment to deploy and run small (2-10 person), remote camps all over the North Slope.



Heavy Haul Trucking

We offer heavy haul road service in the Prudhoe Bay area and can transport freight like rig mats, frac sand, SuperSacks, and heavy equipment (loaders, excavators, PistenBullys, etc). Each of our semi trailers can haul up to 110 tons of freight.

Environmental Remediation Support

We are EPA and DOT certified for hazardous waste hauling. We also offer 24-hour spill response. Our team members all have spill response training and are 40-hour Hazwoper certified.



Tundra Freight Hauling

We can handle any kind of freight going to any village on the North Slope, whether it's hauling in heavy equipment and construction materials or hauling out waste. We get the necessary permits, load it properly to avoid damage, and haul it carefully over some pretty extreme terrain.

Custom Fabrications

We work with clients to build or customize equipment to fit their needs. Examples include adding skis to a fiber optic reel trailer, reinforcing pipe tubs, and building a containment trailer onto an existing unit.
